Discovery questions that surface budget, decision-maker, and timeline fast. Pricing and packaging frames including two-option offers, anchor pricing, urgency without pressure. Objection handling that keeps you friendly and in control. Follow-up cadences, templates, and a lightweight pipeline tracker. Email and DM scripts you can copy, paste, and personalize. Takeaways: printable call outline, proposal and quote template, 3 follow-up messages for "ghosted" leads, and a one-page pipeline

sheet.
